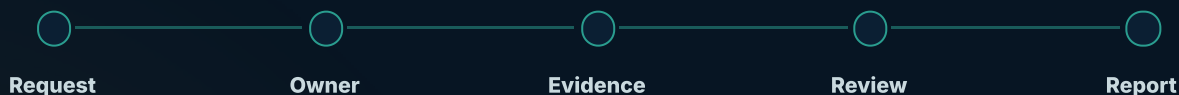

Put one recurring privacy workflow into an accountable operating system.

A practical guide for Nigerian DPOs who want to connect evidence, ownership, reviews and reporting—and judge the operating result in 30 days.

WHAT THIS GUIDE HELPS YOU DO

Put one recurring privacy workflow into an accountable operating system in 30 days.



THE INTERNAL OPERATING GAP

Storing privacy information is not the same as running the workflow.

When the operating record is split across everyday tools, the DPO must repeatedly reconstruct what exists, who owns the next step and what is ready to report.

01

Evidence is scattered

Supporting files sit across inboxes, shared folders and spreadsheets without one view of the request they belong to.

02

Ownership is unclear

Owners, due dates and handoffs are difficult to see, so progress depends on personal reminders and follow-up.

03

Reviews are reconstructed

Management or regulatory review requires the team to rebuild context before a decision can be made confidently.

04

Reporting stays manual

Status and evidence must be reconciled by hand before the DPO can explain what is complete, missing or blocked.

Files preserve information. Privacy Operations keeps the work, owner, evidence, review, and reporting context moving together.

THE OPERATING MODEL

Connect each request to the people, proof and decisions behind it.

Privora organizes one internal workflow as a visible sequence, so the team can work from a shared record instead of coordinating through disconnected updates.

Request

01

Define the internal requirement—such as a DPIA register, vendor evidence, training record or incident history—with its evidence and due date.

Owner

02

Assign the accountable internal owner and make the next responsibility visible.

Evidence

03

Keep supporting files and context connected to the request they are meant to prove.

Review

04

Record review status, questions and decisions without losing the operating history.

Report

05

See what is ready, missing or blocked before management or regulatory reporting begins.

ONE CONNECTED RECORD

The owner, evidence, current status, review decision and reporting context stay together in one connected operating record.

THE FOUNDING PILOT

Start with one organization and one defined workflow.

The pilot creates a focused 30-day operating cycle with enough structure to assess the workflow without widening scope too early.

01

Defined scope

One organization and one defined Privacy Operations workflow, selected around an active evidence, review or reporting need.

02

Founder-led onboarding

The ₦25,000 initial payment reserves kickoff; onboarding then sets the workflow, named owner, evidence context and practical result to inspect.

03

Weekly operating review

Review ownership, evidence progress, questions and decisions each week while the workflow is active.

04

End-of-pilot decision

At day 30, assess the operational result and decide whether an annual Privora subscription is the right next step.

TOTAL FEE

₦50,000

INITIAL PAYMENT

₦25,000

BALANCE

Balance due by day seven after onboarding.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION CREDIT

100% of the completed pilot fee is credited toward an annual Privora subscription when conversion occurs within 30 days after the pilot ends.

FIT AND NEXT STEP

Use the pilot when one real internal workflow is ready to move.

The strongest starting point has active evidence work, a responsible owner and a review or reporting need the team can assess during the pilot.

- A recurring internal privacy workflow is difficult to coordinate
- Evidence and follow-up currently live across separate tools
- A named internal owner can participate during onboarding
- A management or regulatory review creates a real reporting need
